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















Who is best on the issues? A Labour clean sweep...






British voters have had a clear answer to the Reagan question for a while...



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


Four more Tory headaches




- Proportional swing Labour winning more where more is needed

- Return of Farage hitting the Tories harder because he sat the last one out




...Proportional swing: both polls and local elections show Labour are making the biggest gains where they need the biggest swings



Tactical voting: voters in recent local elections have coalesced behind whoever is second place in Con held seats




SNP to Labour swing in Scotland is even bigger than Con to Labour swing in England & Wales

- Then, to finish, throw on some populist Farage brandy, and ignite...





Views of migration levels for student and student dependants








The UK public reject the principle of allowing universities the freedom to recruit students from abroad
